INTRODUCTION

Each year, the Commission for Educational Exchange between the United States of America, Belgium and Luxembourg offers Fulbright awards for study, teaching or research in the United States. The awards, approximately fifty, vary from round-trip travel to grants covering all expenses for an academic year. Only students, teachers, research scholars and lecturers who are citizens of Belgium are eligible for these grants and awards. Applications from citizens of other EU Member States are accepted for the Fulbright-Schuman program (US-EU affairs) only.

In awarding the grants, the Commission's Board of Directors gives priority to candidates who are pursuing projects that will be of lasting benefit to the grantee and his or her country.

The candidates must:

- demonstrate academic excellence;
- be individually interviewed in English;
- be apt to benefit from the academic opportunity offered to them;
- have ambassadorial qualities;
- and be good representatives of their own country while they are in the United States.

Since one of the fundamental purposes of the Fulbright exchange program is to increase understanding between the peoples of the countries involved, the Board of Directors gives preference to candidates who have had no significant opportunity to live in the United States. Grantees are expected to return to their own country upon completion of the project for which the award was made.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- 1. Departures normally take place between August 1 and March 31. Special authorization must be sought in order to leave at another time of the year.
- 2. Recipients of Commission awards must travel on US Government-sponsored "Exchange Visitor" visas. They *may not* travel on any other visa type. Please note that anyone admitted as an Exchange Visitor to the United States must return to his or her home country for two years before returning to the United States as a permanent resident, temporary worker, trainee or intra-company transferee.
- 3. Candidates to study must have completed a cycle of education beyond the secondary level at a recognized institution, with outstanding academic results.
- 4. Candidates in education (i.e. teachers or administrators) must have had 3 years professional experience at the time of application.
- 5. Candidates in research must hold a European doctorate or its equivalent at the time of their departure.
- 6. Candidates in medicine must have received the degree of Doctor in Medicine before leaving for the United States and must intend to do research. Awards are not available for clinical training.

- 7. Each year the Commission offers approximately 10 grants to lecturers and researchers, 20 to graduate students, and 2 to secondary school teachers. Student awards are normally for a minimum period of one academic year. However, applicants for predoctoral research for a minimum period of 6 months will also be considered. Research and lecturing awards are for a minimum period of 3 months in no more than 2 different institutions. Secondary school teachers may participate in special summer programs.
- 8. The value of awards is indicated below. Candidates must be able to cover all other expenses.
- 9. Applications should be made while candidates are in correspondence with specific institutions concerning affiliation and financial support. <u>No awards can be confirmed</u> until candidates have submitted written evidence that they will possess adequate funds to carry out their plans in the United States.

Candidates should submit a **Preliminary Application** <u>http://www.fulbright.be/application.doc</u> to the Commission for Educational Exchange at their earliest convenience so that their eligibility to compete for an award may be determined. (Academic records, suitability of project, and knowledge of English are factors in determining eligibility.) Every year there are five distinct competitions for the various Fulbright awards. Detailed **Final Applications and all supporting documents** are due before or on the last working day nearest to one of the five competition deadline dates: October 31, January 15, March 1, April 30, or June 1 as indicated below.

IMPORTANT: Candidates must be available in Belgium for a personal interview in English. Further, under no circumstances will the Commission give grants to candidates who are already in the United States.

1. FALL COMPETITION. Final Application Deadline: 31 OCTOBER

<u>Students</u> and <u>Research Scholars</u> completing or having completed a cycle of post-secondary education may be eligible for one of the following awards for an academic year of graduate study or research in the United States:

Frank Boas Scholarships for Harvard University

These two awards cover all or most expenses for candidates continuing their education at Harvard:

- 1. The Frank Boas Scholarship in International Legal Studies
- 2. The Frank Boas Scholarship for Graduate Study

Candidates for the Frank Boas Scholarship for Graduate Study or Research may be in any field of study except business administration and must have completed a year of work-related experience by the time of departure for the United States. Successful candidates will also receive travel grants from the Commission for Educational Exchange.

Foreign Language Teaching Assistants (FLTA) Program

University <u>graduate students</u> and/or <u>secondary school language teachers</u> who have had three years of teaching experience or less are eligible to apply for this program to work as language teaching assistants in American colleges and universities. Successful candidates will be placed at a university where they will teach, serve as resource persons in conversational situations, work in language labs, etc. Tuition, room and board and a monthly stipend will be provided by the university. The Commission will provide a travel allowance as well as health and accident insurance. Candidates must be aged 29 or younger at the time of departure for the U.S.

Fulbright-Hays Journalism Grant

This scholarship is designed to aid journalists (specifically those engaged in a career in print or broadcast journalism) to study for a period of three to nine months at an accredited U.S. university.

The grant of \$15,000 - \$30,000 is intended to cover part of tuition and fees, books and academic supplies and room and board. Visa sponsorship and health/accident insurance are provided by the Commission for Educational Exchange.

Candidates must be citizens of Belgium or Luxembourg, have a degree equivalent to a licence/licentiaat, have ambassadorial qualities, a proven level of academic and/or professional excellence as well as outstanding results. In addition, all candidates must have at least **two years of professional experience in journalism**, be proficient in English, and have a specific program and/or project based on opportunities offered at American universities.

All eligible candidates who have completed and submitted the final application by the **October 31** deadline must be present for a personal interview in English which will be scheduled by the Commission.

2. JANUARY COMPETITION. Final Application Deadline: 15 JANUARY

Summer Seminar in American Studies

<u>Professors</u> and <u>teachers</u> in higher secondary education may apply to attend a two-month summer program in American Studies. All expenses are paid by the Commission. Because the program is so intensive and time consuming, no dependents may accompany the grantee during this program.

3. RESEARCH SCHOLARS COMPETITION and FULBRIGHT-SCHUMAN PROGRAM Final Application Deadline: 1 MARCH

Fulbright Awards for Research Scholars and/or Lecturers

The Commission will only consider applications in this competition from <u>research scholars</u> <u>and/or lecturers</u> who are assured of a position with an American institution of higher education. Approximately 10 grants-in-aid and travel grants will be available for candidates who will undertake a minimum of three months of research or lecturing at an American university or institution of higher education.

Fulbright-Schuman Grants

Approximately 11-13 awards will be available for <u>EU academics</u>, professionals or policy <u>makers</u> for research or post-graduate study on EU affairs or US-EU relations at an accredited American university or independent research center. Each award includes a monthly stipend, plus round-trip travel, health and accident insurance and visa sponsorship. Open to nationals of all 27 EU Member States. Candidates are responsible for arranging their own affiliation and can submit projects tenable in a maximum of two different U.S. institutions. To be eligible, candidates must also have a minimum of two-years professional or academic experience in at least two EU Member States.

Two to four one-semester awards for lecturing on EU affairs or US-EU relations, integration, and/or political economy at a selected American university (EU Scholar-in-Residence program).

4. SPRING COMPETITION. Final Application Deadline: 30 APRIL

The Commission will only consider applications in the Spring Competition from <u>students</u>, who are assured of admission to an American university or institution of higher education for graduate-level study or pre-doctoral research.

Fulbright Awards

Approximately 20 grants-in-aid and travel grants will be available for candidates who have completed their higher education and wish to study at an American university. The awards listed below are granted by the King Baudouin Foundation, upon recommendation of the Commission:

Allen & Overy Award

At least one partial scholarship will be offered by Allen & Overy to a graduate of a Belgian university for graduate study in law in the United States.

Ambassador Blinken Award

At least one partial scholarship will be offered by the Ambassador Blinken Award Fund to a graduate of a Belgian university for graduate study in business or foreign policy in the U.S.

Ambassador Fox Award

At least one partial scholarship will be offered by the Ambassador Fox Award Fund to a graduate of a Belgian university for graduate study in any field of study in the U.S.

American Women's Club of Brussels Award

A grant-in-aid will be offered by the American Women's Club of Brussels to a woman nominated by the Commission.

Baker & McKenzie Scholarship

At least one partial scholarship will be offered by the Baker & McKenzie Scholarship Fund to a graduate of a Belgian university for graduate study in international or comparative law in the United States.

University of Chicago Alumni Award

One or more partial scholarships to students in any field of study who will attend the University of Chicago.

Columbia Club of Belgium Award

At least one partial scholarship to a student in any field of study who will attend Columbia University.

Dorothy Deflandre Scholarship

At least one partial award for graduate study in any field at an American university or institution of higher education.

Freshfields Bruckhaus Deringer

At least one partial scholarship will be offered by Freshfields Bruckhaus Deringer LLP to a graduate of a Belgian university for graduate study in International Business Law in the United States.

Fulbright Alumni Association Award

Al least one partial award for graduate study in any field at an American university or institution of higher education.

Fulbright Environmental Studies Award

At least one partial award for graduate study in environmental studies at an accredited American university.

Harvard Club of Belgium Scholarship

At least one scholarship will be offered by the Harvard Club of Belgium to a candidate in any field of study attending Harvard University.

Liedekerke, Wolters, Waelbroeck & Kirkpatrick Award for Graduate Study in Law

At least one partial scholarship for graduate study in law at an accredited institution in the United States.

Linklaters De Bandt Award

At least one partial scholarship for a graduate of a Belgian university to undertake graduate study in law in the United States.

McKinsey Scholarship for Graduate Study in Business

At least two partial awards for graduate study leading to a Master's degree in business administration or related fields at an accredited institution in the United States. The amount will vary according to the financial need of the candidate. Preference will be given to candidates who have proven leadership in professional or extracurricular activities, or who have a record of community service activities.

5. FULBRIGHT AWARD FOR SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY Final Application Deadline: 1 JUNE

The Commission for Educational Exchange is pleased to announce a new international Fulbright award for PhD study in the fields of <u>science</u>, technology and engineering. The award will cover the first three years of study at an American university. Specifically, all grantees will receive tuition, a monthly stipend for up to 36 months, health and accident insurance, a book and equipment allowance, research allowance, professional conference allowance, travel support, and specially tailored enrichment activities. After three years, U.S. universities will be expected to cover the remaining expenses toward completion of the Ph.D.

There are 45 awards offered worldwide. Eligible fields include; Aeronautics and Astronomics/Aeronautical Engineering; Astronomy/Planetary Sciences; Biology; Chemistry; Computer Sciences/Engineering; Engineering (electrical, chemical, civil, mechanical, ocean and petroleum); Environmental Science/Engineering; Geology/Earth and Atmospheric Sciences; Information Sciences/Engineering; Materials Science/Engineering; Mathematics; Neuroscience/Brain and Cognitive Sciences; Oceanography; and Physics.

IMPORTANT: Candidates must be available in Belgium for a personal interview in English. Further, under no circumstances will the Commission give grants to candidates who are already in the United States.

Belgian American Educational Foundation (B.A.E.F.)

The B.A.E.F. awards grants for graduate study and post-doctoral research to citizens of Belgium. Candidates must apply within four years of having completed their degree at a Belgian university. Grants are for one year and cover tuition, living expenses, and health insurance. The B.A.E.F. also awards conditional grants up to a maximum of \$100,000 payable over a period of two academic years to Belgian students wishing to obtain an M.B.A. in the United States. Rotary Scholarships

The Rotary Foundation offers three types of scholarships: Academic-Year Ambassadorial Scholarship; the Multi-year Ambassadorial Scholarship and the Cultural Ambassadorial Scholarship. The first two grants are open to everyone except "...for unsupervised research, medical internship or residency, or for employment on a full-time basis in the host country." The general requirements stipulate that a student must have completed at least two years of university course work, be a candidate in practical training or a vocational field, must have a high school diploma and must have worked for at least two years in a recognized vocation. The three types of scholarships are:

1. Academic Year Ambassadorial Scholarship

One academic year (9 months). The grant of a maximum of \$22,000 covers round-trip transportation between the home and host country; a month of intensive English if required by Rotary; fees for books & supplies; minimum living costs and limited incidentals.

2. Multi-year Ambassadorial Scholarship

Two or 3 years depending on availability through the sponsoring sector. The grant of \$11,000 per year is designed to meet costs of enrolling in and attending a university. The student must go to a university that offers a program directly in relation to his/her field of study.

3. Cultural Ambassadorial Scholarship

Candidates must have studied English for at least one year at the university level. The grant covers a 3 or 6 month period, depending on availability of funding through the sponsoring agency. A period of three months is attractive for those who have reached a certain knowledge in the language. The six month term is appropriate for a candidate who wishes to study a language presenting a high level of difficulty. The grant of \$10,000 (3 months) and \$17,000 (6 months) covers round-trip transportation to and from the applicant's country, tuition, fees, limited living expenses.

"The availability and types of Rotary Foundation Ambassadorial Scholarship are determined by each Rotary district and vary from year to year. Candidates must contact their local Rotary clubs to determine if and what kind of scholarships are available, to ask about local application deadlines, and to obtain application materials." Candidates or their families may not be members of the Rotary. Apply by the end of February (18 months before departure) to the Rotary Club in your area (see local phone book). Candidates from District 217 must apply by November 15 (2 years prior to departure).

-Georgia Rotary Student Program
