



## IMPORTANT TRENDS AND HIGHLIGHTS

- The U.S. is the 5<sup>th</sup> study abroad destination for Belgian students, following France, the United Kingdom, the Netherlands, and Germany. (Source: UNESCO 2012)
- The number of Belgian students in the U.S. is at its highest point in this century.
- Interest in short-term and non-degree study in the U.S. has increased by 54% over the past 5 years.
- The top U.S. host institutions are New York University, Stanford University, the University of Illinois at Champaign-Urbana, Columbia University, and the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.
